**WNJU-Telemundo 47's *Noticiero 47 A Las Once*** took home the Emmy® for best “Evening Newscast (Under 35 Minutes)” for its July 18, 2007 broadcast.

**WABC-TV** took home the Emmy® for best “Evening Newscast (Over 35 minutes)” for its story *The Aftermath of the Steam Pipe Blast*.
